It has ensured that children are active for longer periods and their engagement and enjoyment has increased. • Playground equipment has given more opportunities for children to engage in active play at play and lunchtimes. • Additional resources purchased support many of our vulnerable children that need to develop their physical skills outside of P.E sessions ensuring their individual needs are met in physical development. Resources within the EYFS have provided opportunities to enhance physical development with more children achieving greater understanding in this area. • Sports coaches have ensured high quality teaching across all outside games and developed own staff confidence and professional development. • Dance workshops through the academic year have given the children wider opportunities to develop their understanding of different cultures and faiths. • Swimming instruction has led to a greater number of children reaching 25 metres
