### PUPIL PROGRESS BOOKLETS FOR TERM 2

These were all sent home to parents with email addresses last Thursday morning using Integris. Although this did take me most of the morning we have saved the cost of printing, paper and plastic pockets which does represent a saving over the 6 terms. Hard copies of Pupil Progress Booklets will be sent to the few families without email addresses.

As we have reached the point that is one third of the way through the school year, it is hoped that children will have achieved the target of 33.3% if they are on track to meet end of year national expectations in July.

In mathematics, children have been developing multiplication and division skills in KS2 which are huge areas of learning and require lots of practice and application but are represented by very few learning objectives on the chart. This means that in mathematics percentage figures could fall below 33.3% but it anticipated that this will have improved by the end of term 3.
