PARENT HUB

FLU IMMUNISATION PROGRAMME

This took place last week for participating children from Reception to Year 4. The school provides the venue and the immunisation programme is run by school nurses who collate the permission slips. We are aware that local medical practices are all taking a different approach and as a result some children may have missed out. Mrs Ecob has made calls but it is an NHS issue. As a result, they are offering sessions at the Johnson Hospital on 11th, 12th and 13th December between 3.30 and 4.45 but paperwork must be completed before you go.

MORNING ARRANGEMENTS

The school gate will be opened by 8.30 am. There are mornings when this can be a few minutes earlier but it depends on what else is happening inside school – and some days are much busier than others with phone calls and visitors. It is expected that parents will wait with their children or that they will make an arrangement with another adult to keep them safe until the gate opens. There have been a few incidents of children being left by themselves recently which puts children at unnecessary risk.
